SAFE TRANSPORTATION OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- 1. Never mix chemicals.
- 2. Bring items in original containers or clearly mark contents. Tell staff if you are unsure what is in a container.
- **3.** Tighten all covers and lids.
- 4. Avoid spills. Put waste containers upright in a sturdy container and place securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van (all boxes or totes can be returned).
- 5. If container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak proof pail or tub.
- 6. Gasoline should be transported in a designated red safety container.
- 7. Motor oil should be transported in a durable and leak-proof container labeled with the words "used oil."

RESIDENTIAL SHARPS





WHAT IS RECYCLABLE?



PLASTICS

- ONLY (1)(2)(5)
- Containers, cups, lids, bottles & take-out clamshells
- Corrugated plastics (political or vard signs)

PAPER, CARDBOARD & CARTONS

- Newspaper, shiny inserts, magazines & office paper
- Hardcover & paperback books
- Shredded paper is OK, but must be in a sealed, clear plastic bag!
- Mail, receipts & envelopes (including those with windows)
- Cards & gift wrap (no tissue paper, foil paper or glitter)
- Corrugated cardboard (broken down & not preventing lid from closing)
- Egg, milk, juice, soup, broth & wine cartons

ALUMINUM, TIN & STEEL

- Christmas lights, extension cords & electrical wire
- Aluminum, tin & steel cans
- Clean aluminum foil, plates & containers
- Pots and pans

GLASS JARS & BOTTLES

• Jars and bottles of any color (leave lids on)

MOVING, DECLUTTERING OR LOOKING TO THRIFT?

Winona County has several thrift stores to consider donating your gently used items. Thrift and reuse stores are a great way to reduce the amount of waste that goes into a landfill, and enforce the motto of

"Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!" It's also a great way to support local businesses! Make sure to call and verify that they can accept your items.

WHAT IS NOT RECYCLABLE?

- PLASTIC BAGS & FILMS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE (even if they are labeled (2))
- Plastics labeled 73 74 76 77 Must go in the trash!
- Plastic with no number? Trash it!
- Pet food & bird seed bags
- Food waste
- Yard Waste
- Bubble wrap
- Ceramics & dishware
- Coffee maker carafes
- Loose shredded paper
- Paper towels, napkins, plates, cups & tissues
- Polystyrene foam cups, containers & packing peanuts
- Window glass & mirrors
- Medical waste
- Plastic wrap
- Motor oil containers cannot go in your cart, even with a 2 on the bottom. Throw oil containers in the trash; oil residue creates a hazard at the sorting facility.



PRO TIP: If you use a plastic bag to collect your recycling, dump your recyclables loosely into the cart and throw away the bag or reuse it for your garbage collection.

APPLIANCE & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

These items can be taken to **Redbox; Matejka Recycling** or Miller Scrap. Dishwashers, stoves, washers & dryers can be



recycled at no charge. Recycling appliances with Freon (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners & dehumidifiers) costs \$30-\$35. In the spring, Winona County ponsors a free appliance collection where appliances with Freon are ccepted **for free** at these locations. These businesses will also recycle your electronics waste for a fee.


MATTRESS RECYCLING

1. When you purchase a new mattress, ask your local mattress store where to recycle your old one; or

2. Drop off at La Crosse County Landfill to be recycled or dispose of at Miller Scrap or Redbox;

Matejka Recycling for a fee.





PLACEMENT TIPS

- Place carts at the end of driveway or on the boulevard, within 1 foot of the curb.
- Lids must be **completely closed**.
- Place carts where they can be emptied with the automated arm. Drivers cannot get out to move carts, or pick up excess recycling outside of cart due to liability concerns and truck design.
- Carts must be at least 3 feet from fixed objects (mailboxes, trees, streetlights, parked cars) & with a 3foot gap between carts, otherwise automated arm does not have enough room to empty the cart.
- If you do not have a driveway or boulevard, set cart in street just past the edge of the curb.

DO NOT PLACE ANY PLASTIC BAGS IN THE CART


NO plastic shopping or garbage bags holding your recyclables. The machines at the sorting facility cannot separate thin plastic bags from other recyclables, and the entire bag will end up as garbage. Worse, plastic bags get wrapped around the spinning axles of the sorting equipment, and shutdowns of the line are required in order to remove them. These shutdowns increase sorting costs, which in turn increases program costs.

If you are collecting your recycling in a plastic bag, dump your recyclables loosely into the cart and throw away the bag or reuse it for your garbage collection.











WINTER REMINDERS

Clear snow from cart area Do not place cart on snow bank Use the call-in line for updates

• Arrows on lid must point toward the allev/street.

• Position carts on as level a surface as possible. • Rural areas: set cart on right side when exiting driveway.

COMMON REASONS FOR A MISSED PICKUP

LATE SET-OUT

Carts set out after 6:00 am may not be collected. If the collection truck goes through your neighborhood before your cart is set out, they will not be asked to return.

PLASTIC BAGS

If you use a plastic bag to collect vour recyclables, **vou must dump** them loosely into your cart.

LID OF CART NOT CLOSED

If the cart is over-filled, and doesn't completely close, the automated arm cannot work the way it's intended. Material may spill out of your cart and will not be picked up.

RECYCLABLES OUTSIDE THE CART

Recyclables, such as excess cardboard, were left on the ground outside the cart. Drivers are not permitted to exit their vehicles for safety concerns.

TWO TOUGHEST RECYCLING ISSUES: PLASTIC BAGS & CARDBOARD

EXTRA CARDBOARD?

As we purchase more online, we generate more cardboard than can fit into our blue cart. It is very important that cardboard be broken down into smaller pieces. Large and bulky pieces of cardboard can block other recycling when the cart is turned upside down,



leaving the cart not fully emptied. Tall pieces of cardboard that obstruct the lid from closing should not go in your cart. If the material is too high then the cart cannot be emptied. Self-haul extra cardboard to Miller Scrap or Redbox; Matejka Recycling at no cost.
