Mattress RECYCLING



- **1.** When you purchase a new mattress, ask the local mattress store to recycle your old one; or
- 2. For home pick-up of an old mattress, without the purchase of a new one, contact a hauler that will recycle your mattress; or
- **3.** Take your mattress to the Residential Drop-off area at the County Landfill for a fee or contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 608-783-6727, to find other drop-off locations.

Styrofoam NEWE Recycling



New in 2024! The Department, in partnership with Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling and 7 Rivers Recycling, will be accepting Polystyrene (Styrofoam) foam for recycling. Standard disposal fees apply if dropped off at the landfill drop-off site.

Landfill Fees All items dropped off will have a fee

Residential Drop-off Area: \$5 minimum or a \$120 per ton

- Garbage (normal household waste)
- Large Items (furniture, toys, bikes, stoves, grills, washers, dryers)
- **Demolition/Constuction** (wood, drywall, flooring, roofing, doors, windows, etc.)

Processing Pad: \$5 minimum or a per ton fee

Landfill: \$15 permit fee and \$64 per ton

Mattresses & Boxsprings:

- Recycled: \$12 each + weight
- Landfill: \$18 each + weight

Freon Items: \$12 plus weight

(refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, de-humidifier)

Brush/Clean Wood: \$35/ton (wood that has not been painted, stained, or treated)

We accept cash, check, and credit/debit cards. A fee will be added to use credit/debit cards:

- \$1.95 on \$66.12 or less
- 2.95% on \$66.13 or more


Only people authorized by site attendants may utilize the landfill facility. You must provide your own labor for unloading materials. Due to safety concerns, we do not permit salvaging once waste is placed into containers.

PLEASE READ SIGNAGE

The Landfill's address is 3240 Berlin Drive. The diagram to the right illustrates the entrance to our facility (the landfill is the second right on Berlin Drive). The landfill entrance is equipped with inbound and outbound scales - all landfill customers must scale in and out. Department staff are available at the scale to direct you on disposal options and collection of payment.

For mailing, billing, and other departmental questions our office is located at 3200 Berlin Drive (first right on Berlin Drive) and parking is available on the south side of the building. We can also be reached at (608) 785-9572.

Village of Bangor Recycling of Yard & Garden Waste, Brush & Branches, Large Items, and Appliances

Yard & Garden Waste (on calendar)

Yard and garden waste will be picked up on Monday and Friday. It must be placed in CLEAR bags. Grass, leaves and garden waste ONLY! No paper, glass, animal feces or other non-garden waste. Please be considerate, our employees do have to open every bag. This is a service that may be discontinued if rules are not followed. Bags over 30 pounds will not be picked up. Branches and sticks must be stacked or bagged separately. Remember it is unlawful OUTDOOR

to dump dirt, grass or leaves on any public street.

Brush & Branches (on calendar)

Brush and branches will be picked up and chipped twice each month, on the first and third Tuesday. Please pile stacks parallel with the street.

Large Items (on calendar)

Large items such as bundles of carpet (rolled and cut into 4-foot lengths or shorter), couches, chairs, tables, dressers, humidifiers, and lawn mowers (gas tank empty, oil drained) are picked up four times each year. The dates for these pickups in 2024 are January 2, April 1, July 1, and October 7. Large items that are not acceptable for pickup will not be picked up. You may contact Harter's directly at 608-782-2082 with any questions. These "Large Item" pickups are not intended for boxes or bags of trash that could fit into Village trash totes, or for remodeling or construction materials.

Appliance Pickup

Appliances must be recycled in a special way and will be picked up on the same dates as the "large items" for a small fee. They should be placed where you normally place your trash and recyclables. The pickup fee is \$35.00 per appliance. This fee must be paid to the Village Clerk by noon the Friday before the pickup date.

The fee is non-refundable.

Appliances include:

refrigerators & freezers (do not leave food inside them, and remove the doors)

stoves dishwashers microwaves

waterheaters air conditioners dehumidifiers

furnaces washer/dryer

Televisions must be disposed of by contacting Harter's Quick Clean-Up directly at 608-782-2082.

Mattress/Box Springs Pickup

Mattress and box springs will also be picked up on the same day as the "Large Items". The pickup fee is \$35.00 each and must be paid to the Village Clerk by noon the Friday before the pickup date. The fee is non-refundable.

Unacceptable Trash

Remodeling and demolition materials

Items include, but are not limited to: roofing, plumbing, multiple windows, sheetrock, brick, concrete, asphalt, bathtubs, shower enclosures, and lumber. Please make arrangements with a private rubbish hauler for disposal of such material. For disposal of glass doors or windows, contact Harter's Quick Clean-Up at 782-2082.

Hazardous materials

Cleaners, solvents, gasoline, oil, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials may not be placed in the regular trash. Refer to the front page to see which hazardous materials are accepted at the La Crosse County Household Hazardous Materials Site. If in question, call the facility for a recommendation at 608-785-9999.

Vehicle oil and batteries

Return to service stations or authorized dealers. A fee may be charged.

Vehicle parts

Vehicle parts and other metal weighing 10 pounds or more will not be collected. Take such items to a salvage yard.

Trash Guidelines

Trash is picked up every Monday. Your regular pickup day may be delayed one day in the event of a holiday.

All trash must be placed curbside by 6:00 AM.

Trash and Recycling Program (on calendar)

The Village of Bangor contracts with Harter's Quick Clean-Up of La Crosse to collect trash and recyclables. Harter's Quick Clean-Up will pick up trash weekly and recycling every other week on the same day. Your regular pickup day may be delayed one day during weeks when a holiday occurs.

Remember, recycling is **mandatory** in the Village of Bangor. **Recycling items include aluminum cans, tin cans, glass jars and bottles, plastic (#1, #2, #4, #5), newspaper and cardboard.** These items need to be placed in your recycling tote, not your trash tote.

Trash Totes

The tote for trash will be supplied by Harter's Quick Clean-Up. The cost for totes is \$16.34 /mo. plus any fuel surcharge when applicable. Contact Harter's Quick Clean-Up at 608-782-2082 to arrange for your trash tote.

Recycling Totes

Harter's Quick Clean-Up will provide each residence with a recycling tote to hold steel, tin, and aluminum cans, glass jars and bottles, #1, #2, #4, and #5 plastics, newspaper and cardboard. To have these recyclables picked up at your home, they must be placed in this tote.

You do not need to separate your recyclables. Place cans, glass, plastic, newspaper and cardboard loose in your tote.

Do not take totes with you when you move. They should stay with the property.

Per Sec. 6-2-12 of the Village of Bangor Code, it is unlawful to dump rubbish, dirt, snow, grass, leaves, etc. on any public street, sidewalk or alley. Such unlawful material may be removed by the Village at the cost of the violator.

How to Prepare Recyclables

GLASS:

Jars and bottles only!

- **NO** light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window glass, mirrors, or ceramics.
- Remove lids and metal rings, empty, and rinse clean.



TIN CANS: Empty food, paint, aerosol cans only!

• NO chemicals, scrap metal, or vehicle parts.

Holidays: No refuse or recycling pickup.

Collections will be a day late.

 Empty, rinse clean, and remove labels. Ends of cans can stay attached.



ALUMINUM: Cans only!

Drain liquid and rinse cans clean.



PLASTIC: Containers/ Bottles only!

- NO plastic packaging or Styrofoam.
- Look for #1, #2, #4, #5 mark
- Rinse clean.

- What is a carton? It's a type of food and beverage packaging. There are two types: shelf-stable (broth, soup, soy milk, juice, milk, wine) and refrigerated (milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes).
- Drain liquid, rinse clean.

Place glass, tin cans, aluminum cans, plastic, paper, cardboard and cartons together loosely in recycling tote.

NEWSPAPERS/MAGAZINES/CARDBOARD/CHRISTMAS LIGHTS/EXTENSION CORDS

- Junk mail, cardboard and cereal boxes with out liner. NO SHREDDED PAPER.
- Newspapers (including shiny inserts), magazines, and telephone books are acceptable.
- Christmas Lights/Electrical Extension Cords





The Village recycles ONLY the items listed in this brochure. Items such as plastic wrappers, plastic bags, and nonrecyclable containers should be placed in your regular trash.

Free for La Crosse County, WI residential users (unless otherwise noted below)
Houston County, MN and surrounding counties (Fees apply to all acceptable items)

Acceptable Materials

- Automotive fluids
- Batteries (rechargeable, lead acid, lithium)
- Cell phones and digital cameras
- Cleaning products
- Computers (desktops, laptops, tablets)
- Computer peripherals (fax machines, hard drives, keyboards, mice, printers, scanners, speakers)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Lawn and garden chemicals
- Medications (non-controlled only)
- Mercury-containing devices (barometers, thermometers, thermostats, etc.)
- Microwaves and small Freon appliances Fees Apply
- Paints, stains, varnish and solvents
- Pool chemicals
- Propane cylinders (20# and under)
- Sharps and needles
- Smoke detectors
- TVs and computer monitors Fees Apply
- Vape pens/E-cigarettes
- Video devices (cable and satellite receivers, DVD players, gaming consoles, VCRs, etc.)
- Water filters (Point of Contact)

Non-Acceptable Materials

- Compressed gas cylinders (other than propane)
- Controlled substance medications
- Explosives (inc. black powder, fireworks, military munitions, and flares)
- Shock sensitive materials (picric acid, etc.)
- Radioactive materials

SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP!

These items can and should go into your regular curbside trash or recycling:

- Alkaline batteries (trash)
- Dried out paint (trash)
- Empty paint and aerosol cans (recycle)
- Fertilizer without pesticide (trash)
- Ice melt and rock salt (trash)
- Incandescent light bulbs (trash)

Fees apply to all items for residents who live outside of La Crosse County.

FREE PRODUCT REUSE ROOM!

Over 80,000 pounds of useable household products are sorted and made available to the public in our Reuse Room annually. All items are free, but donations are appreciated. The Reuse Room is open Monday – Friday from 8 AM to 4 PM. The Reuse Room is located on the east side of the landfill office building, directly adjacent to the HHM Facility.

Safe Transportation of Hazardous Materials

- 1. Never mix chemicals.
- **2.** Bring items in original containers or clearly mark contents. Tell facility technician if you are unsure what is in a container.
- 3. Tighten all covers and lids.
- **4.** If a container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak-proof pail or tub.
- 5. Avoid spills. Place waste containers upright and place securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van. Do not transport waste containers in vehicle passenger areas.
- **6.** Gasoline should be transported in a designated red safety container.



- 7. Motor oil should be transported in a durable and leak-proof container labeled with the words "Used Oil."
- 8. Tape the terminal ends of batteries with clear tape to prevent arcing. Do not co-mingle batteries with chemicals.
- **9.** Transport fluorescent bulbs securely to avoid breakage. Do not tape bulbs together.
- **10.** Upon arrival, pull under the HHM canopy and remain in your vehicle with the engine shut off.



- Needles, syringes, auto-injectors (EpiPens) and lancets must be transported in sealed, puncture-resistant containers.
- Container options include a standard red sharps container or a thick plastic laundry detergent bottle with screw on cap. All containers must be labeled with the word "SHARPS."
- Additional sharps collection sites can be found on the Alliance to HEAL website.
- For after-hours service, a red sharps drop box is located on Berlin Drive at the La Crosse County Solid Waste Department entrance. This drop box accepts single-use needles as well as small sharps containers. (see map above)
